The course provides pupils with the opportunity to analyse a set play text and live production, as well as explore the disciplines of acting, directing and design. 
COURSE OUTLINE

Drama is a practical, hands-on subject that develops your creativity, imagination, and your artistic skills.

The Higher course is split into two components. For your performance exam you will take on the role of an actor, director or designer, performing and presenting your ideas for that role. This is weighted as 60%. A visiting assessor will mark this component. Then you complete a written exam which is worth 40%.







You will explore one of the following roles:

<u>Actor</u>

You will perform in two 10 minute contrasting performances where you document your rehearsal process and identify the performing concepts you have used to inspire your performance.

Director

You will run a 30 minute rehearsal for the visiting assessor where you deliver your directing concepts for your chosen play - ultimately staging a section of the script with a select group of actors.

<u>Designer</u>

You will pick a play and create a concept and design the set for the whole play. You will take on an additional production role (lighting, sound, costume, props or hair and make-up) to showcase your chosen concept.



WRITTEN PAPER 40%

The written paper is split into three sections.

<u>SECTION 1 - THEATRE PRODUCTION: TEXT IN CONTEXT</u>

For Section 1 you will explore a play in class. You will learn to analyse the play and consider how you would stage that play.

SECTION 2 - THEATRE PRODUCTION: APPLICATION

For this section you are given National 5 style questions in the paper and use the knowledge and skills you learned in National 5 to write about different acting, directing and design concepts to stage a particular section of the play.

SECTION 3 - PERFORMANCE ANALYSIS

For this final section you will watch and analyse a live or pre-recorded performance. You will then write about that performance from a specific angle using all prior knowledge on what you have observed; why certain decisions were made, how they were performed and what impact that has on the audience.
