Courses with extra support for school pupils available at North East Scotland College

This programme is available at both Aberdeen City and Fraserburgh campuses.

WHAT IS THE SCHOOL LINK COURSE?

- It allows you to try out different options in College to help you plan your future and perhaps come to College full-time later on
- It also helps you to build the skills you need for future success
- The School Link course is for pupils in their last year at school who have been working at National 2-3 level who may have had some extra support at school.

WHEN WILL YOU BE AT COLLEGE AND HOW WILL YOU GET THERE?

- The course is one day per week, a Friday between 9.00am-3.45pm at the Aberdeen City Campus or a Thursday between 10am-3pm at the Fraserburgh Campus
- If the school has informed the College that help is needed in class or at breaks, a College Learning Support Assistant will be with you in your class. All workshop-based sessions have an LSA in the class.

WHO WILL HELP ME IF I HAVE A PROBLEM?

- You will meet your tutor on the first day of the course
- · Your tutor will give you advice and help with any problems you may have
- Your tutor will check that you are at College and if not, your school will be informed.

WILL I GET BREAKS?

 You will usually have a 15-20 minute break in the morning and afternoon and 45 minutes for lunch at Aberdeen City Campus and 1 hour at the Fraserburgh Campus

WILL I GET LOST?

- · You will be given a schedule which will show the rooms you are in
- We will show you how to find the rooms at the beginning of the course
- If your school has told us that you need more help, a Learning Support Assistant will go with
 you at breaks so you will not have to worry.
